# South Brunswick Public Library

The South Brunswick Public Library loans free Wifi hotspots to individuals and families to increase their access to the internet and the library's many digital resources.

A hotspot is a small device you can use to connect a wireless enabled device, such as a laptop, smartphone, or tablet, to the internet. By lending these hotspots, the South Brunswick Library helps to fulfill its mission to Inspire, Empower, Discover, Connect. Whether you need wireless at home or on the go, the South Brunswick Library is ready to assist you with our new hotspot kits!

### Who Can Borrow:

- South Brunswick Library card holders 18 years of age or older
- Patrons in good standing. To be in good standing you must have no lost items on your card and fines must be below \$10.00

### Terms and Conditions:

- The hotspot kits can be borrowed for up to two weeks, with one renewal if no one has the item on hold.
- Hotspots can be placed on reserve and must be picked up within four days of notification of availability or the item will go to the next customer in the queue.
- Wifi hotspots must be checked out and returned to the Borrower Services Desk and not placed in the library's bookdrop or the bookdrops in town
- If returned late, there will be a .50 per day overdue charge with a \$10 cap.
- The patron is responsible for damage, loss, or theft. If any problems are encountered, patrons should return the device immediately to the Borrower Services desk.
- If the kit is lost, stolen, or returned damaged, a patron will be charged the replacement cost of the missing item
- The South Brunswick Library is not responsible for any information a patron accesses using a Wifi hotspot or any actions they take while online. Using the hotspot to access any online content determined to be illegal or obscene according to federal, state or municipal law will result in the revocation of hotspot borrowing privileges and potentially criminal prosecution.
